

AAIR INFUSION CENTER

AAIR's infusion services continue to expand each year. In 2013 we performed 1305 infusions and we have experienced further growth in the first quarter of 2014.

AAIR offers state-of-the-art facilities for intravenous (IV) infusions of medications for treatment of a number of rheumatology, gastroenterology, nephrology and dermatology conditions. We do not infuse drugs used to treat cancer patients. Currently, the medications infused include Remicade, Rituxan, Actrema, Orenica, Boniva, IVIG, Solu-medrol, Benlysta, Krystexxa and Simponiaria. We also offer services for injectables such as Cimzia, Simponi and Prolia, where there is a risk of reaction. New drugs are being offered in the market every year and our research center continues to conduct clinical trials to test the efficacy of new drugs in the treatment of rheumatologic and allergic diseases.

Our primary infusion center is located at our Brighton office. In February 2014 we opened a second infusion center at our Greece site in order to treat patients living on the west side of the city. The centers are staffed by experienced infusion registered nurses experienced in starting and monitoring IV's. There is always a physician or certified nurse practitioner on site during the procedure. You will be seen by one of our providers during your infusion. We have the latest IV programmable pumps and vital sign monitors. Both centers have comfortable reclining chairs with headsets to watch TV, listen to music, read or sleep. There is ample free parking at each site. You will receive competent and compassionate care in a private, quiet and stress free environment.

Infusion services are covered by most insurers as long as there is a referral from your physician and approval by your health plan to receive these drugs. Our billing staff can assist you in determining your coverage or what it will cost you out-of-pocket.
